He never met a stranger, and considered many family. My brother... was extraordinary. The hole he leaves in our hearts, our family, and our community is extraordinary. Thousands of tears have been shed over him while his mind and spirit, left him, but none of the pain we endured over the last two years compares to the peace we now have in knowing his suffering is over. This separation is just "tempatary" though, we will see you again. Don't think this is the end for Jason, oh no, rejoice, for he has been made whole.

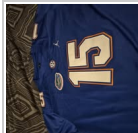
