Louis Nolan Cook, 88, of Old Town, Florida, was born August 18, 1933 to the late Albert and Elizabeth Cook in Chester, Florida. He went to his heavenly home on August 4, 2022.

Nolan was a Veteran of the United States Air Force and served during the Korean War. After his honorable discharge, he began his 39 year career at Rayonier, a pulp and paper mill in Fernandina Beach, FL. He retired as a shift supervisor in 1993 and moved to Old Town to enjoy his retirement years. Nolan enjoyed boating, fishing and found his church home at Rock Sink Baptist Church.
