Mary Sue Ludlam, 64, of O'Brien, Florida passed away September 29, 2021. 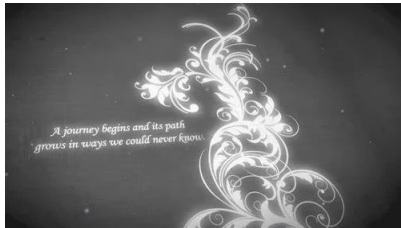

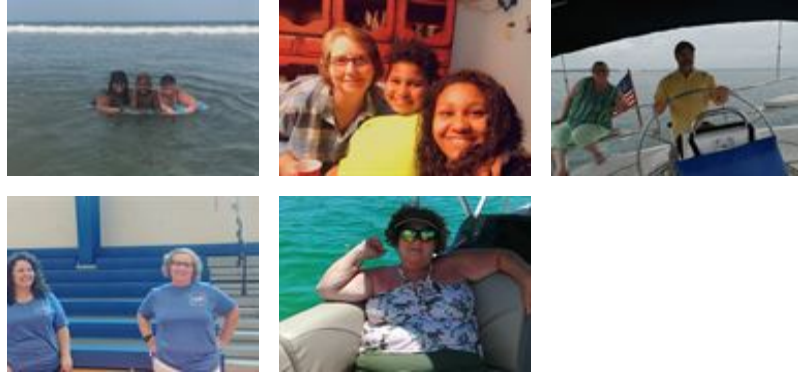
